CHRISTOPHER H. WEBBER MEMORIAL FELLOWSHIP

The Webber Family and Bike & Build are honored to introduce the Christopher H. Webber Memorial Fellowship, an annual grant to a Bike & Build alum in memory of Chris Webber, a Bike & Build alum and the organization's Program Director from 2005 to 2007.

ABOUT CHRIS

Christopher H. Webber was a Trip Coordinator for Bike & Build's 2005 Northern U.S. route, and became the organization's first Program Director that fall. As Programming Director, Chris helped oversee the organization's growth and strengthened its programming through his combined passion for sport and adventure, and affordable housing and charitable efforts.

Chris carried himself with great attitude, spirit, and energy for his work, family, and friends. He had completed two cross-country bicycle trips, was an expert skier, and had travelled widely through Europe, Australia, and North America.

Chris was 25 when he died of injuries sustained in a pedestrian accident in New York City in March of 2007.

ABOUT THE FELLOWSHIP

The Christopher H. Webber Memorial Fellowship honors Chris' spirit and his involvement in and contributions to Bike & Build. As a Bike & Build alum and a staff member, Chris had a special perspective and a unique connection to the organization and its participants. To honor his involvement as both a participant and staff member, the CHW Fellowship will be awarded annually to a member of the Bike & Build family.

The award - a one-time annual grant of up to \$5,000 - will fund an individual's involvement in affordable housing efforts, and may be used to finance his or her participation in a project, help start or expand an organization, finance academic research or other studies, supplement his or her income earned from employment, or involve the individual in affordable housing efforts through any other traditional or non-traditional manner.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

The CHW Fellowship award will be made to applicants that satisfy the following criteria:

- Are members of the greater Bike & Build or Habitat Bicycle Challenge families.
- Support his or her involvement in affordable housing efforts.
- Demonstrate a clear need for funding of up to \$5,000.
- Demonstrate the likelihood of a high impact of the proposed project.

SELECTION PROCEDURES

Fellowship recipients will be determined through a comprehensive review of the applications by members of the Webber Family and the Bike & Build community.
